Books of the Western genre are set in the American Old West primarily during the second half of the 19th century, though there are contemporary Westerns as well.

Traditionally, the stories are centered on the life of a nomadic cowboy or gunfighter, armed and riding a horse. Cowboys and gunslingers typically wear Stetson hats, cowboy boots and buckskins. Other characters may include lawmen, bounty hunters, outlaws, cavalry soldiers, settlers—both farmers and ranchers—and townsfolk.

Westerns often stress the harshness of the wilderness and frequently set the action in an arid, desolate landscape of deserts and mountains. The vast landscape can play an important role, as described by Peter Cowie, "...mythic vision of the plains and deserts of the American West." Specific settings include ranches, small frontier towns, saloons, railways and isolated military forts of the Wild West.

The Western genre may feature dual or subgenres of any other type including Romance, Comedy, and even SciFi.

Authors of Classic Westerns include Louis L'Amour and Larry McMurtry. For examples of Current Western authors, look for Robert Parker, Johanna Lindsey, Cormac McCarthy, Anne Proulx or Janet Dailey.


