- Wheelchair/stroller access to both levels
- Brand new Teen/YA room
- Elevator between upper and lower levels
- Safety/traffic-flow improvements at front steps/door
- New enclosed space for meetings, study room, and programs
- ADA bathroom(s) with infant-changing facility
- Public drinking fountains
- Hand-washing sink, lower level
- Integrated staff office/circulation desk area with better traffic flow
- Improved lighting throughout
- New roof and repairs to unsightly ceiling damage
- New wall surfaces (no more 1980s paneling) and paint
- New carpet/flooring throughout
- Electric outlets conveniently located for patron use
- Improved HVAC throughout
- Increased space for YA, children's and adult fiction collection
- Kitchenette for program use
- Safety/security improvements throughout
- Large rear terrace and wheelchair ramp
- Robust exterior lighting

One thing that will not be changing: The charm of this "original Carnegie Library" that has been so beloved in Freehold for nearly 120 years.
