ORDINANCE #2023/20

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT TITLE 10 "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF FREEHOLD

WHEREAS, the Borough of Freehold (the "Borough") is a public body corporate and politic of the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have become aware of the necessity to regulate the particular four-way intersection of Ford Avenue and Lloyd Street for safety concerns of traffic and pedestrian crossing, in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Borough; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF FREEHOLD AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1

Title 10 "Vehicles and Traffic" of the Code of the Borough of Freehold shall be amended as follows; additions to the current ordinance are noted in underline. [Unmodified sections were omitted for the sake of brevity].

10.08.040 Stop intersections.

H. In accordance with the provisions of this section, the intersection of Ford Avenue and Lloyd Street is designated as an all-way stop intersection. Stop signs shall be installed on all corners of the intersection of Ford Avenue and Lloyd Street.

Schedule IX

Stop Intersections

In accordance with the provisions of Section 10.08.040, and as indicated on the map attached hereto and made a part of this section by reference (a copy of which is on file in the office of the borough clerk), the following described intersections are designated as stop intersections. STOP signs shall be installed as indicated.

Section II

If any part of this Ordinance shall be deemed invalid such part shall be deemed severable and the invalidity thereof shall not affect the remaining part of this Ordinance.

Any Ordinance or portions thereof which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed and superseded.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication in accordance with Law.
